Group 1: Beginning to Intermediate Supervision Group

Group 2: High Intermediate to Advanced Supervision Group

Each group 5 Sessions (over 10 weeks),

Group 1: Beginning to Intermediate Practitioners

This supervision group of six sessions is aimed at the beginning to intermediate practitioner. We will discuss yours (and my) cases and theory in detail. We will embed some of the 'closer to start' theory. The supervision, which runs once per fortnight for 90 minutes, with a maximum 6 participants, will combine a mix of case-based and issues-based content.

Ideal for the beginning to intermediate practitioner who wants to enhance their practice through a group supervision process with an experienced supervisor able to guide the group members to 'go deeper' than they may have gone so far in their practice. We will also discuss the 'hows' of doing work in the room, where applicable.

Group 2: High-Intermediate to Advanced Practitioners

Five sessions aimed at the high-intermediate to advanced practitioner. We will discuss your (and my) complex cases and advanced theory. The supervision, runs once per fortnight for 90 minutes, with a maximum 6 participants and combines a mix of case-based and issues-based content. Ideal for the high-intermediate to advanced practitioner who wants to enhance their practice through a group supervision process with an experienced supervisor. The group is ideal for those practitioners who want to be challenged or assisted in thinking about complex cases from various theoretical perspectives. Practice suggestions will also be discussed.

Note: Russ is a forensic registered psychologist and AHPRA-endorsed supervisor, however this group is suitable for both psychologists and social work trained therapists. The sessions can also be used for the purpose of specialist registration for psychologists. Contact Russ to discuss.

ABOUT RUSS PRATT

Dr Russ Pratt has over 20 years' experience working therapeutically with sexual assault and abuse, trauma, attachment, family systems and child protection issues. From 2010 until 2017 he was Statewide Principal Practitioner with the Office of Professional Practice in the Department of Health and Human Services and prior to that was manager and senior clinician of the AWARE program for sexually abusive youth at SECASA. He holds specialist registration as both a Forensic and Counselling psychologist. He was a member of the Therapeutic Treatment Board (a Ministerial appointment) from 2012 to 2017. He is a member of the NSW Children's Guardian's Expert Advisory Panel, an ANZATSA board member, a Fellow of ATSA (USA), and a board member and 'elder' of the National Adolescent Perpetrator Network (USA). Russ regularly writes and presents both nationally and internationally regarding youth exhibiting sexually abusive behaviours, the impacts of pornography on sexual practice, and other various issues. Russ continues to work with sexually abusive youth, to write and research topics relevant to the field. He is currently undertaking research with Cyra Fernandes (ACF) on therapists' views on the impact of pornography on sexually abusive youth.

Russ can be seen and heard regularly through print, television and radio, as he is a popular interviewee and speaker on the topics of sexual abuse, pornography and trauma.
